Michael Szabo graduated from the University of Waterloo School of Architecture in 1992 where he received the AIA Medal in his thesis year. He is a registered member of the OAA, RAIC and is a LEED AP.

His projects include the Peter Gilgan Centre for Research and Learning at Sick Kids Hospital in Toronto; the integrated sustainable design for the University of Ontario Institute of Technology Campus Master Plan and Buildings, which received the RAIC Award of Innovation Excellence and the SCUP award for campus design; the Marion McCain Faculty of Arts and Sciences at Dalhousie University, which received the

Lieutenant Governor's Award; and the Camilla and Peter Dalglish Atrium at the Royal Botanical Gardens, which received the CISC Award of Excellence. Michael has designed custom homes in the Caribbean and Canada.

Michael speaks regularly on carbon reduction in the built environment at conferences and co-leads the office sustainable design committee. He was instrumental in the development of our ecoMetrics tool that captures data from our energy simulation models.
